



Spring Flower





Make these cheerful spring flowers!

These would look lovely strung as a garland, made into a brooch, or sewn onto bags and blankets.

There are lots of ways they can brighten up your home...

## You will need:

Any yarn weight in 2 colours

One hook size smaller than you would normally use, e.g. DK yarn = 3mm crochet hook, aran yarn = 4mm crochet hook

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Please note: This pattern is written in UK crochet terms.

## Stitch reminder:

**Treble (tr):** yarn over hook first, put hook through stitch, pull yarn back through (3 loops on hook), yarn over hook, pull through 2 loops (leaving 2 loops on hook), yarn over hook, pull through last 2 loops.


**Double Treble (dtr)**: wrap yarn around hook twice before inserting through stitch, pull yarn back through (4 loops on hook), yarn over hook, pull through 2 loops (leaving 3 loops on your hook), yarn over hook, pull through next 2 loops (leaving 2 loops on your hook), yarn over hook, pull through last 2 loops.

**Slip Stitch (sl st):** put hook through stitch, pull yarn back through stitch and straight through the loop on your hook

**Round 1** In first colour make a magic ring,








ch3, make 11 tr in ring, pull tail to tighten, join with sl st to third of 3 chain, fasten off (12 stitches including ch3)



change colour by joining in any stitch, \*ch2, in next stitch make

4dtr, ch2, sl st in the following stitch\*\* repeat from \* to \*\* all the

way around



Fasten off, weave in ends.
